HORTICULTURE REPORT

NO SOIL? NO FOOD!

The Dust Bowl of the 1930's was named the number one weather event of the 20th century. One dust storm was 1500 miles long, 900 miles across and 2 miles high and carried dust from the middle of the country to 300 miles out into the Atlantic Ocean. Over 100 million acres of land may never be productive again. I remember hearing about it in school, but I never thought about it much. I believed that such a thing could never happen again because civilization had learned how to avoid such a disaster.

The truth is that we do know how to protect the land better than we used to, but that knowledge is not being implemented in most farming situations. Instead, soil is being tilled with large mechanized farm equipment, farmland is left without cover crops for months, crops are not being rotated and there are no patches of forest left in fields. There is also the heavy use of pesticides and synthetic fertilizers. Combine these practices with increases in flooding and drought conditions caused by climate change, & you have the perfect recipe for a worldwide Dust Bowl and catastrophic crop failure.

The UN Food and Agriculture Organization estimates that 95% of the Earth's topsoil could be at risk by 2050 unless farming practices are changed. Leaving topsoil as undisturbed as possible, returning nutrients to the soil and employing practices that reduce the chance that soil will be blown or washed away are the practices that must be employed.

One may ask how we could ever run out of dirt. We probably can't, but we are running out of top-soil. One teaspoon of productive topsoil has 100 million to 1 billion bacteria, several yards of fungal filaments, several thousand protozoa and scores of nematodes. (Makes you want to wear your garden gloves, huh?) Soil is a "jungle of voracious creatures eating and pooping and reproducing their way towards glorious soil fertility." (Oregon State University web site). Topsoil varies in depth but averages 8 inches deep worldwide. Some places have none and have turned into deserts and some places have much more. Iowa had topsoil depths of 14-18 inches at the beginning of the 20th century but, 100 years later, it had 6-8 inches. The United States is eroding soil on cropland 10 times faster than it is being replenished. Saving our topsoil is of upmost importance and very achievable.


